

DIRECTIONS FOR FINAL WORLD HISTORY PROJECT

Objective: You will work with a group to present a brief history of a country from the end of the Cold War (1991) to the present. Your group will choose from the following countries: China, Russia, India, Nigeria, Brazil, Mexico, the Philippines, and South Africa). Your group will give a basic overview of conditions in the country today, before describing the modern history of the country. Your goal is to educate the class about the current population of the country, and then outline some of the biggest challenges facing the nation, before finally presenting possible solutions. (Standard 10.10 and 10.11)

Product: Your group will present your final project to the class in the form of a PowerPoint, video, or some (teacher approved) technological presentation.

- All the presentations need to include relevant data that helps to explain the issue to the class.
- You will need to include basic information (use the website [www.http//prb.org](http://prb.org) for background information)
- You will need to include a timeline with at least three major events in your country's recent history
- You need to identify at least three challenges facing your country (and suggest possible solutions)

Research: You will need to find current statistics that support your project. Your textbook can provide some basic information, but will not provide sufficient information to complete a good project. On your own time you will be expected to visit the library, Internet, and any newspapers, magazines, or periodicals that will help you gain more information.

Timeline: The project will be presented to the class on _____. You need to have it completed before that date. You should also run through the presentation before class to make sure that everything runs smoothly and that the presenters all know what they will be doing during the presentation.
